





## **LOW VOLUME ROADS WORKSHOP 2022**

#### **Lake Sumner Road**

- 40km long
- Access to LINZ and DOC land 115,355 HA
- 28,000HA in 3 runs







### Lake Sumner Road – how feasible is it?

- Not near road reserve
- History of washouts 
  Powerful river
- No alternate route

- Minor realignments
- More to come?

South branch of Hurunui River undermined the road.
